#### PLEASE READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY BEFORE FILLING OUT THIS APPLICATION.

- 1. Students must possess a valid driver's license and vehicle registration. They must provide a photocopy of each document to purchase a JHS parking permit.
- 2. Students and parents must complete, sign and date this application form.
- 3. Students and parents must read the Lake Washington School District's Parking Policy below.
- 4. All delinquent school fees and parking fines must be paid prior to purchase of a parking permit.
- 5. The required parking fees must be paid in full to obtain a permit.
- 6. Parking passes will be issued on a first come, first served basis.
- 7. Students will be assigned a designated parking area.

Before filling out the application, please read the Lake Washington School District Parking Policy and the Juanita High School Parking Policy.

### <u>Lake Washington School District Policy:</u>

"By issuance of this permit, the Lake Washington School District does not assume liability for any property damage to any private automobile parked on its property. The owner-operator(s) of all private vehicles accepts responsibility for their own property and agrees that they have parked at their own risk."

### Juanita High School Policy:

"All students, including Running Start and WANIC, who park their vehicle(s) on Juanita High School's campus during normal school hours, must have a visible and valid current Student Parking Permit properly displayed on their vehicle. Violators are subject to towing. A Parking Permit is to be used only by and for the car and driver for whom it is issued. The Parking Permit is not transferrable and may not be resold by the student. Students must turn in their Parking Permit when directed to do so.

If you leave campus in your vehicle without permission, your Parking Permit may be revoked without a refund! You can also have your pass revoked if you transport students in your car who do not have an off-campus pass.

Drivers transporting other students in their trunks will immediately have their passes revoked.

Parking lot citations will be issued for the following:

- Parking without a valid and visible Parking Permit. All parking tags MUST be displayed in the designated spot.
- 2. Improper parking of vehicle. This includes not properly parking in stall, (taking more than one place, blocking accessibility, etc.), parking in restricted spaces (fire lanes, bus lanes, handicap only parking, pool, staff or visitor parking areas, curbs, grass, etc.), or not parking in assigned parking area.
- 3. Parking without authorization not registering a new/second vehicle with the school.
- 4. Failure to follow safe driving procedures will result in a citation or suspension/revocation of parking privileges. This would include: speeding, racing, improper passing, going against the designated traffic flow, driving over curbs/medians, transporting other students in an unsafe manner, and any behaviors deemed to be unsafe or harmful to others.

**NOTE:** Repeated violators may be towed at the owner's expense. Violation and sanctions are specifically detailed in the Juanita High School Student Handbook.
