1. This Wednesday is **"Super Wednesday"**!

All 10th graders will be taking the PSAT at Juanita on Wednesday! 11th and 12th graders who signed up to take the PSAT or SAT will also be on campus on this day.

PSAT students should come to the Commons when they arrive, before 7:50. Rosters will be posted so they know their testing location.

SAT students will head directly to the Field House, unless directed otherwise.

Buses will operate on a normal schedule. Students will receive breakfast and lunch. This is a regular Wednesday, 7:50-1:10 schedule.

All other students will stay home and engage in teacher-assigned, asynchronous activities. Attendance will be taken on this day.

- A. 9th graders will stay home and engage in synchronous and asynchronous activities.
- B. 10th grade students will take the PSAT (link to [PSAT student guide](#)) at JHS (more details to come)
- C. 11th grade students have the option to take the PSAT (link to [PSAT student guide](#)), or to engage in synchronous and asynchronous activities at home.
- D. 12th grade students will have the option to take the SAT (link to [SAT student guide](#)), or to engage in synchronous and asynchronous activities at home.



2. Washington State Healthy Youth Survey 2021

NEXT WEDNESDAY DURING ACT

Our school is participating in the Washington State Healthy Youth Survey on Wednesday, October 20th, during ACT. The survey will be given to students in Grades 10 and 12.

The Healthy Youth Survey includes questions related to physical activity and diet, unintentional and intentional injury, substance use, sexual behaviors, abuse, risk and protective factors, and access to school-based services. Survey results are used by schools, communities and state agencies to plan programs to support our youth and reduce their risks.

Participation in the survey is voluntary and the students' answers are anonymous.

JHS will be administering the survey online this year. No privacy issues were identified in the E-survey pilot conducted in 2019. This year, schools and districts are being instructed to disable any recording, keystroke tracking, and video capture software on school-issued devices used to take the survey. They are also going to instruct students to do the same on personal devices used to take the survey before they begin. If you use any software to monitor the device your student will use to take the survey, please turn it off before they begin to ensure their honest participation.

If 11th or 12th graders signed up for the SAT or PSAT, they will be receiving test day information soon.



3. Attention AP Students and students hoping to take AP Exams in the Spring:



- Payments can be made **now through October 30th**.
- Exam fees are **\$98** per exam.

Exam waivers are available for students receiving Free and Reduced Meal Services.

4. Fall State Assessments: SBA and WCAS Testing is coming at the end of October.

This will be in place of the SBA and WCAS tests that weren't administered in the Spring of 2021. As you can see, 9th graders will be taking the abbreviated 8th grade ELA, Math, and Science exams. 11th graders will be taking the 10th grade ELA and Math exams, and 12th graders will be taking the 11th grade Science (WCAS) exams. This is also an option for Seniors to satisfy part of their Graduation Pathway.

Tests will occur on October 26th, 28th, and 29th (tentatively)

AP EXAM PAYMENTS NOW ACCEPTED – October 1st to October 30th

AP Exams are \$98.00 per exam. Payment for AP exams may now be paid online at <https://payments.lwsd.org> with a debit or credit card. In person payments may be made with cash or check at the Bookkeeper's window. Last day for in person payment is Thursday October 28th at the end of 2nd lunch. Online payments will be accepted until 11:59 pm on Saturday October 30th.

Students who qualify for the Free and Reduced lunch program may qualify for a reduced fee waiver. Please contact Mrs. Grager or Mr. Ivy to see if you qualify.

There are a **limited number of scholarships available** for students who do not qualify for the FRL program. Please see **Mr. Ivy or Mrs. Grager** for information.

For students that may still be deciding if they want to take AP exams in May, LWS D is offering a LATE AP Exam Registration and payment window from February 1, 2022 through end of last lunch on February 16, 2022. Students who register during the late AP Registration window will incur a \$50 per exam late fee in addition to the \$98 per exam fee. Late fees apply to all students including students who qualify for reduced fee exams.

College Board has reinstated the cancellation fee for this year. The cancellation fee is \$45.00 per exam.

Nutrition Services

Currently, in-person students are allowed one free lunch per day. In order for the meal to be free, the student must have 3 of the 5 components on their tray when going through the payment line, with 2 of the components being a fruit & vegetable. Due to this requirement, our kitchen staff are pre-plating all meal with the required components. If the fruit & vegetable are not on the tray when going through the payment line, they will be charged at the a la cart price for the items on their tray. There are signs posted throughout the cafeteria stating this.

The 5 components that make up a meal consist of: dairy, meat/meat alternate, whole grain, fruit & a vegetable. A juice can be taken in place of a fruit.

Any extra items a student wishes to have, will be charged at the a la cart price.
