Some entries on the list are characters, others thematic ideas, setting, symbols, etc. Your job is to think about these ideas as you read. The strongest students will develop a way to harvest their thinking – using post-it notes, taking notes, annotating, etc. Though note-taking is not required, you will be asked to comment and/or write about all the items on the list upon your return to school in September.
